- Create a poster about the pros and cons of training to be an

- Create a cartoon strip about an alien landing on Earth or Doctor who has discovered a new planet (English and Art).

- Design your own alien and write words to describe them (Art and English).

- Dress up as an astronaut and create a fact file about yourself on a poster (English and Topic).
